ABOUT OUR SOILS

Our soils are designed for both the home gardener and landscaper in mind. Choosing the correct soil for both your garden and plant type is crucial to maintaining healthy plants and lawns.

Working out the amount of soil you need ensures that you have the correct amount rather than too much or not enough by guessing your measurements.

Our soils are sold by the cubic metre and by the bag.

If you supply our staff with the measurements of the length, the width and the depth your garden in metres and centimetres, we will be able to work out how many cubic metres that you require.

Sandy Loam is a soil type that is used for grass and plants that require lots of drainage in order to grow. Sandy Loam is a soil that contains sand as a dominant component as well as containing silt and clay.

- Ideal for use on new lawns using either instant turf or seed.
- For top dressing and repairing existing Lawns.
- To plant Palms, Ferns, and Native plants as it is lower in nutrient content than other soils.
- Not suitable for pots

Lawn Mix is a soil type that is also used for grass and plants that require lots of drainage in order to grow.

- Ideal for use on new lawns using either instant turf or seed.
- For top dressing and repairing existing Lawns.
- To plant Palms, Ferns, and Native plants as it is lower in nutrient content than other soils.
- Not suitable for pots

Premium Garden Soil is a well-draining soil that has a blend of 70% soil and 30% compost

- Ideal for use in garden for flowering plants, trees and shrubs
- For use in Vegetable Gardens to plant straight into
- For use when planting fruit trees
- Not suitable for Lawns, Palms, Ferns or Natives
- Not suitable for pots

Budget Garden Mix Soil is an inexpensive alternative to garden soil, however it is a heavy soil that is low in nutrient content and is not as free draining as other soils and can become boggy.

- For use in garden beds
- For use in deep garden beds to help raise the garden level
- Not suitable for pots
- Not suitable for Lawns, Natives, some palms and some ferns
- Not suitable for plants that require lots of drainage

Screened Filling Soil is an inexpensive clay like soil that has been screened to remove rocks and impurities to be used as a base.

- Ideal for levelling ground especially for new gardens
- Ideal for raising ground to a workable level
- Not suitable for Pots
- Not suitable for growing plants or lawns in

Mushroom Compost is a blend of wheaten straw, chicken manure, and gypsum composted and pasteurized (heated to kill bacteria) prior to growing a mushroom crop. Once mushrooms are harvested it is then used in gardens as a compost. It contains almost all nutrients needed for good plant growth, improves soil structure, and conserves soil moisture.

- Ideal for rejuvenating established gardens
- Ideal for rejuvenating Vegetable gardens after harvesting
- Ideal for breaking up clay by digging in over a period of weeks
- Ideal as a mulch for established gardens, especially roses
- Not suitable to plant directly into.
- Not suitable for pots
- Not suitable for Lawns, Palms, Ferns or Natives

Potting Mix is a mixture of composted bark and river sand used for planting in pots

- Suitable for pots only
- Fertiliser may need to be added
